Volunteers needed for Community Stories Committee

The Windsor-Detroit Cross-River Tour is an international Community Benefits Plan initiative that will celebrate the unique culture, history and diversity of the Sandwich/west Windsor and Delray/Southwest Detroit communities through interpretive signage that will be installed on pedestrian and cycling paths leading to the Ports of Entry in Windsor, Ontario and Detroit, Michigan. To deliver this initiative, the project team will engage local community members and subject matter experts through the Community Stories Committee to support the development of content for the interpretive signs that celebrates important moments in each community's history.

Representatives are needed to fill two-year positions in the following roles:

Canada

- Three representatives of cultural and historical associations within Windsor-Essex County
- One representative that is a resident of the Sandwich community
- One representative that is a resident of Windsor-Essex County

US

- Three representatives of cultural and historical associations within the Greater Detroit Area
- One representative that is a resident of the Delray community
- One representative that is a resident of the Greater Detroit Area

The deadline for applications is **noon on Thursday, September 1, 2022**, from eligible volunteers to fill the ten open volunteer positions on the Community Stories Committee.

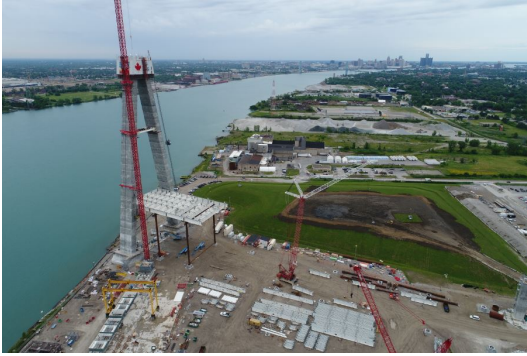

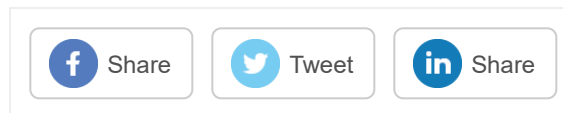
