# ENVIRONMENTAL, SOCIAL AND GOVERNANCE PLAN QUARTERLY REPORT - WINTER 2024





The Gordie Howe International Bridge project is a new border transportation system being constructed between Windsor, Ontario and Detroit, Michigan, including the bridge, two state-of-the-art ports of entry and a connection into the US interstate highway system. Managed by Windsor-Detroit Bridge Authority (WDBA) and working in collaboration with the State of Michigan, the project is being delivered through a public-private partnership (P3) with Bridging North America.

Published in 2023, WDBA's ESG Plan has consolidated efforts undertaken since the start of WDBA's operations in 2015 into a roadmap that actively supports the creation of a thriving and sustainable future. The Plan's activities align with WDBA's four anchors of ESG: Environment, Community, Corporate Culture and Corporate Conduct.

With a commitment to transparent and accountable implementation, the project team is proud to report on ESG accomplishments through this quarterly report.

20+ team members participated in an educational Species at **Risk Workshop.** They explored Ontario's diverse reptiles and amphibians, learning how to identify turtle and snake species. Some of these species are local to the region with habitats located adjacent to the Gordie Howe International Bridge construction site. Attendees learned safe handling techniques to manage these species if encountered on the construction site.

WDBA acknowledges that the land where the Gordie Howe International Bridge project is being constructed sits on Anishinaabe Territory. The Anishinaabeg in the Windsor area are known as the Three Fires Confederacy which consists of the Ojibwe, Odawa, and Potawatomi Nations. This land has also served as a place of refuge for the Huron/Wendat people.

In 2023, WDBA's Corporate Culture Committee collected staff donations and hosted fundraisers for the Habitat for Humanity Windsor-Essex Build Program. Through individual contributions, a recordsetting bake sale and pizza sales at staff events, WDBA raised \$3,085 to support construction of two new houses in the Sandwich area. In January 2024, 18 staff rolled up their sleeves and volunteered to paint the interior of one of the residences. Their efforts reflect commitment to local families and the broader community. Construction completion was celebrated at a Key Ceremony in February 2024, where two local families received the keys to their new homes.
