The Community Benefits Plan to be delivered as part of the Gordie Howe International Bridge project reflects the regional priorities heard to date, and is comprised of two components:



WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT & PARTICIPATION STRATEGY

Geared toward engaging businesses and providing employment opportunities. The strategy to be finalized and implemented will centre on workforce, training and pre-apprenticeships/apprenticeships.



NEIGHBOURHOOD INFRASTRUCTURE STRATEGY

Focuses on collaborating with stakeholders and community members through consultation to develop a community infrastructure strategy based on identified priorities.

The Neighborhood Infrastructure Strategy is a \$20 million community infrastructure investment focused on priorities identified through community benefit consultation undertaken from 2015-2017. \$10 million will be invested on each side of the border
