

NEWS RELEASE MICHIGAN ADVANCE CONSTRUCTION STARTS FOR GORDIE HOWE INTERNATIONAL BRIDGE PROJECT

July 17, 2018

WINDSOR, ONTARIO – Windsor-Detroit Bridge Authority (WDBA) and Bridging North America (BridgingNA), along with the State of Michigan and the Government of Canada, celebrated today that another significant milestone in the Gordie Howe International Bridge project has been reached with the start of Michigan advance construction.

Advance construction activities include design work to advance foundation construction of the main bridge, test piles, preparation and the start of siphon work at I-75 and geotechnical exploration.

BridgingNA was announced as the Preferred Proponent to design, build, finance, operate and maintain the Gordie Howe International Bridge in early July following a fair, open and transparent process based on a commercially accepted public-private partnership (P3) procurement approach.

To take advantage of the summer 2018 construction season, a separate contract has been signed between BridgingNA and WDBA. This critical work will enable full construction to begin after financial close is reached by BridgingNA by the end of September.

The new Gordie Howe International Bridge will provide for redundancy at the busiest trade corridor between Canada and the United States with improved border processing and highway-to-highway international connectivity. It also addresses future needs and will provide six lanes to meet anticipated growth in traffic over the years to come.

Canada and the United States celebrate the Michigan advance construction groundbreaking for the Gordie Howe International Bridge

Detroit, Michigan, July 17, 2018—The Windsor-Detroit trade corridor is the busiest commercial land border crossing and an important trade and transportation route between Canada and the United States. As a safe and essential additional crossing option at this important corridor the Gordie Howe International Bridge will ensure people and goods move safely and smoothly between the two countries, supporting middle-class jobs and businesses on both sides of the border.

The Honourable Amarjeet Sohi, Canadian Minister of Infrastructure and Communities, and Michigan Governor Rick Snyder today participated in an event to mark the Michigan advance construction groundbreaking for the Gordie Howe International Bridge.

Kelly Craft, United States Ambassador to Canada, James Craig, Police Chief of the City of Detroit, Dwight Duncan, Chair of Windsor-Detroit Bridge Authority's Board of Directors and senior executives from Bridging North America, the Preferred Proponent selected to design, build, finance, operate and maintain the Gordie Howe International Bridge, also participated.

The new six-lane, cable-stayed international bridge will provide direct connectivity to existing highway networks in Windsor and Detroit. Along with modern border processing infrastructure and the capacity to move goods and travelers efficiently through the corridor, it will encourage new investment between Canada and the United States.

Thanks to the continued collaboration of many groups in both countries, the Michigan advance construction groundbreaking for the Gordie Howe International Bridge in the United States demonstrates considerable progress towards the realization of this critical project.

Today's event will allow for the full construction start of the Gordie Howe International Bridge, which will begin after Financial Close in the Fall of 2018.

Quick facts

- Advance construction activities include design work to progress with foundation construction of the main bridge, test piles, preparation work at Interstate 75, and geotechnical exploration.
- The Gordie Howe International Bridge brings opportunities in the form of jobs and contracts for local workers, service providers, and material manufacturers and distributors in both Canada and the United States.
- The Windsor-Detroit Gateway is the busiest Canada-United States commercial land border crossing and is vital to the economies of Ontario, Michigan, Canada and the United States, with some 7,000 trucks crossing each day. About 2.5 million trucks cross the Windsor-Detroit border each year. In 2017 this represented over US\$106.5 billion in bilateral trade (CAD\$138 billion).
- The Gordie Howe International Bridge project includes the construction of:
 - A six-lane, cable-stayed design bridge of 850m (0.53 miles) and a total length of approximately 2.5 km (1.5 miles),
 - Canadian and United States Ports of Entry including approach bridges, customs plazas and a tolling station on the Canadian side; and,
 - o A Michigan interchange connecting Interstate 75 to the United States Port of Entry.
- Once constructed, Canada's Port of Entry will be the largest Canadian port on the Canada-United States border and the United States Port of Entry will be one of the largest in North America.
- Canada and the United States share the world's longest secure border, over which approximately 400,000 people, and goods and services worth US\$1.9 billion (CAD\$2.5 billion), cross daily.
